CONFLICT MINERALS POLICY

Alpplas attaches great importance to a sustainable and transparent supply chain. As part of its commitment to maintaining the applicable ethical, labor and environmental standards, Alpplas has adopted the following policy on the responsible sourcing of conflict minerals: Tin, Tantalum, Tungsten and Gold (3TG).

Alpplas undertakes to refrain from any actions that contribute to the financing of conflicts and comply with the applicable United Nations' sanctions resolutions and, where applicable, the local laws in force to implement such resolutions.

- In order to avoid any action that contributes to the financing of conflicts, our stakeholders, with whom we have any business relations, are expected to comply with the same principles.
- In this context, we expect our suppliers and business partners to:
- Act in cooperation with their own suppliers in order to verify the use of the above-mentioned minerals and, the potential supply sources of these minerals,
- Take actions in cooperation with their own suppliers, which may be exposed to potential risks, for the purpose of mitigating and eliminating the risks or cease to act in cooperation with their suppliers after an unsuccessful attempt to mitigate the risks,
- Not to offer, promise, give or demand bribes for the purposes of hiding or changing the origin of these minerals and, take precautions against such bribery incentives,
- Commit to act in cooperation with suppliers, national or international official authorities, institutions, non-governmental organizations and, if necessary, affected third parties in order to prevent or reduce the risks of adverse effects.

As part of its commitment to environmental compliance and human rights protection, Alpplas is determined to ensure that its products do not contain any 'conflict minerals'.
